2	Go on a shape hunt in your house? What objects can you find			
	that look like a cube, cuboid, sphere, cylinder, pyramid and cone?			
	Can you describe the shapes? How many faces does the shape			
	have? How many squares make a cube? Etc.

3	Can your child design and create a birthday card or invitation to

4	Can you child find 1 more/less than a given number/object? Can			
	they record these as a number sentence in their homework book,			
	e.g. 9 + 1 = 10.

5	Draw a picture of the Christmas stable scene. Can your child	
	remember the story and the visitors that came to see Jesus?	
	Can they label their picture or write 1 or 2 sentences about the	
	story?

	Can your child write an email to Santa and let him know if you	
	have been good this year? I hope so! Please let him know some of	
	the good and kind things that you have done and you could let	
	him know what you would like for Christmas? - Think about each	
	word, sounding it out and listening to the sounds that they can	
	hear. They do not have to spell the words correctly as long as it's	
	phonetically plausible.	
	Go on your child's portal using their login and complete their	
	work using '2do' and click on the work set.	
	Stable Scene	
7	Can you use some old boxes / objects to create a 3D model of 1	
	item from the nativity scene	
	(e.g. a manager, an angel, a shepherd, Mary or Joseph etc.)	
	We will create a whole class nativity scene in school displaying all	
	of the children's work.	
	Weather	
8	As the weather changes and gets colder can you go on a little	
	weather walk with your child looking for the initial signs of	
	winter (look for ice, icicles, wind, frost etc.)	
	As you go on your walk can your child think of words to match	
	the items to create some alliteration phrases?	
	E.g. frosty fence, snowy stones, cold car etc.

- 1. Homework should be quality time for you and your child to share experiences and to ensure that we are involving you in your child's learning.
- 2. Have high expectations (you know what your child is capable of)
- 3. Always praise your child for their efforts.
- 4. Your child's writing must be written in pencil, not pen.
- 5. Please help and guide your child but do not do it for them.
