WELCOME BACK

Welcome back! Below is a brief outline of what we will be learning in each subject during the second part of our Spring Term.

Values and Virtues

This half term our virtues theme is being Faith-filled and Hopeful.

Faith gives us belief and trust in God and other people, we build on it each day through prayer. We are hopeful when we are optimistic and trust ourselves and others, and we don't give up. God is hope.

Religious Education

In RE this term, he children will explore some of the customs and practices associated with the celebration of the Season of Lent. Through the life and teaching of Christ they will learn about prayer, fasting and almsgiving and the forgiveness that God offers to those who believe in him.

English

Our focus text for this half term is 'Desirable' bu Frank Cottrell-Boyce

Throughout this topic, we will be looking at;

Playscripts and discursive writing.

Writing - to use expanded noun phrases, fronted adverbials and selecting adjectives for impact.

Reading - to predict what might happen next in a story by fully understanding the characters and how they might react.

Maths

We will continue to work on multiplication and division.

We will also study fractions and be introducing decimal numbers to one decimal place.

It is essential that the children continue to practise their multiplication tables and division facts. Children will be tested weekly on times tables in preparation for their Multiplication Times Tables Check in June.

Science

This half-term, we will be studying Living things and their habitats.

The children will be able to:

Become experts in the use of classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things. Learn about the 7 characteristics of a living thing (MRS NERG/MRS GREN). Sort living things in a number of ways and make a dichotomous classification key to identify local invertebrates. Make observational drawings of insects.

P.E

This half-term, Year 4 will PE on a Tuesday, where the children will have Dance, taught by Miss Georgina.. They will also have PE on a Thursday, when they will learn the skills of Cricket Please ensure children have the correct P.E for indoor and outdoor lessons.

Our P.E. lessons will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

D&T

During this half term Year Four will study different types of bridges and different ways to create these structures. The children will decide which materials are suitable for making their bridges, which will allow then to apply knowledge of materials and their properties and adapt these materials and shapes to develop strong bridge structures capable of bearing a set amount of weight.

Geography

Our history topic for this half term is Rivers.

The children will be able to name and locate the main rivers in the UK and a number of the World's longest rivers. They will know and label the main features of a river and why most cities are located by a river. The will also be able to explain the features of a water cycle.

PSHE

In PSHE, Year 4 will be working on the Jigsaw topic - Healthy Me.
