The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)



- Purposeful play underpins the delivery of all the EYFS as well as the development and learning of young children.
- Well-planned activities are provided for the children across all the 8 areas both indoors and outdoors all year round.
- Each half term we will have learning opportunities based upon children's interests and our learning will be based around stories and a variety of role-play areas will be created. The role-play area is vital in encouraging speaking and listening but again within this the 8 areas will be planned.

Early Years Foundation Stage Assessment



- Your child's progress will be shared with you at parent's evenings and through other discussions with our reception staff.
- Homework books and expectations – For reception 1 weekly piece to be completed in their orange homework books
- Reading – expectations – Your child should be reading at least three times a week at home and their diary must be signed with the date and a signature. We check your child's diary on a Friday and if they have read will be given a raffle ticket to be in the chance to win a prize.

Basic Information



- Milk, water and fruit are available to the children throughout the day (free of charge)
- Activity Fund - £3.50 every half term (covers the cost a various activities and resources used in class, used for new toys and replacement of broken ones throughout the year. (children have their own money pot)
- Children can choose between hot dinners or a packed lunch. All children in Reception receive universal free school meals.

Basic Information



- P.E. - Children will need a school PE kit in school everyday in a PE bag
- Name labelling – every item must have your child's name on it
- Start and time of the school day –
- 8.40am for reception
- 3:10pm for reception

Uniform

- Navy woollen school jumper/ cardigan
- White shirt
- School tie
- Dark grey flannel trousers (Boys)
- Dark grey skirt or pinafore (Girls)
- Black shoes
- Navy blue gingham dress/ dark grey flannel shorts (Summer Term only)
- Caps (a must during the summer term!)

PE:

- Navy blue shorts/ Navy blue jogging bottoms (No leggings)
- Navy blue school PE top
- Navy jacket
- Black pumps/ trainers (No laces)
